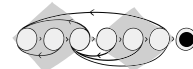

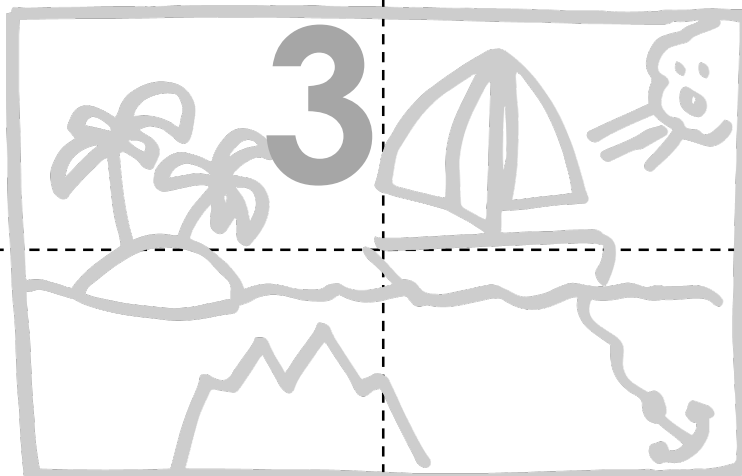
WHAT'S THE GOAL? WHAT VISION IS BEING PURSUED?
